PRIVATE AND TRADES EDUCATION

(NAICS¹ 6114, 6115, 6116 & 6117)

About this report

This is a summary of forecast information available about this industry in the B.C. Labour Market Outlook 2018 edition forecast. 1. Outlook Highlights

The Private and Trades Education industry covers much the private education sector in B.C. and is driven broadly by corporate and consumer demand for the eclectic mix of education choices that supplements the publically funded education industries.

The industry is expected to expand its workforce at a slower pace than average over the next ten years up to 2028. The industry is projected to have approximately 6,700 job openings over the 10-year forecast period. About 93 percent of those job openings are a result of the need to replace workers leaving the labour force.

Specifically, the Private and Trades Education industry includes:

- 6114 Business schools and computer and management training: This industry group comprises establishments primarily engaged in providing courses in office procedures and secretarial and stenographic skills; conducting training in all phases of computer activities, including computer programming, software packages, computerized business systems, computer electronics technology, computer operations and local area network management; and offering an array of short-duration courses and seminars for management and professional development.
- 6115 Technical and trade schools: This industry group comprises establishments primarily engaged in providing vocational and technical training in a variety of technical subjects and trades. The training often leads to non-academic certification. Vocational correspondence schools are also included.
- 6116 Other schools and instruction: This industry group comprises establishments primarily engaged in providing instruction in fine arts; athletics and sports; languages; and other instruction (except academic, business, computer, management, and technical and trade instruction); and providing services, such as tutoring and exam preparation.

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- 6117 Educational support services: This industry group comprises establishments primarily engaged in providing non-instructional services that support educational processes or systems.
