Invitations to Participants to submit a PIF should be forwarded once you have confirmed their eligibility. PIFs must be submitted by the Participant 5 days before the first day of skills training. PIFs will not be accepted beyond 7 days after training begins.

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Examples of Ineligible Participants (All Streams)

- Participants who are employed in full-time permanent positions while taking part in the CWRG-funded project.
- Participants who are under 16 years old at the time of training.
- Participants who reside outside of B.C.
- Participants who do not have a SIN.
- Participants who submit PIFs more than 7 days after training begins.
- Participants not designated under the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act which include, for example, temporary foreign workers and international students.
- A former CWRG Participant who has reached the per Participant funding maximum for the fiscal year (April 1 to March 31). For example, a Participant who received \$15,000 in stipend funding through the Emerging Priorities stream would not be eligible to take part in the project funded by the Indigenous Communities stream.

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
