



BRITISH COLUMBIA LABOUR MARKET OUTLOOK

2022-2032 FORECAST

The British Columbia Labour Market Outlook provides a 10-year forecast of the flow of supply and demand for labour in the province. The forecast is updated every year to give British Columbians the latest information they need to make informed decisions on careers, skills training, education and hiring. The Labour Market Outlook projects the demand for workers will grow. Individuals looking to get their first job, change careers or get back into the workforce can look forward to a wide choice of job opportunities and career paths.


Nearly 80% of job seekers will need some form of post-secondary education or training.

Examples of High Opportunity Occupations

- >> Registered nurses and registered psychiatric nurses
- >> Information systems analysts and consultants
- >> Computer programmers and interactive media developers
- >>> Retail and wholesale trade managers
- >> Nurse aides, orderlies and patient service associates
- >> Early childhood educators and assistants
- Automotive service technicians, truck and bus mechanics and mechanical repairers
- >> Hairstylists and barbers
- >> Contractors and supervisors, heavy equipment operator crews
- >>> Retail sales supervisors

Emerging industries, like the Clean and Care Economies, play a critical role in B.C.'s economic and social well-being. They will remain important for many years to come. Gaining the skills and training needed for these growing industries will help prepare for the future. The 2022 edition of the Labour Market Outlook begins exploring these sectors of the economy.
